NYC Bike Share Overview



What is Bike Share?

Shared-Use Mobility

Network of shared bicycles

Intended for point-to-point transportation

Increased mobility

 Convenient for trips that are too far to walk, but too short for a taxi or the subway


Always available

System operates 24/7

No City funds used to operate

- Membership Revenues
- Sponsorships

6 Years of Citi Bike

Citi Bike Launch: Phase 1 - 2013


- Manhattan & Brooklyn
- 330 stations
- 6,000 bikes

Citi Bike Expansion: Phase 2 - 2015-2017

- Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens
- 750 stations
- 12,000 bikes

Citi Bike Expansion: Phase 3 - 2019-2023

- Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, Bronx
- + 35 square miles
- + 16,000 bikes
- Improved rebalancing & new valet stations



High Ridership

By the Numbers

86+ million trips to date

150,000+ annual members

~ 80,000 trips on busiest days

Record 90,000 trips this past week

+8% Growth
in daily Citi Bike
use from 2017 to 2018

Year-Round Average Trips per Day on Citi Bike

2016: **38,491** 2017: **44,824** 2018: **48,315**

Annual or Short Term Memberships

- Annual
 - \$169/year
 - \$14.95/month**With annual commitment
- Short Term

Single Ride: \$3Day Pass: \$12

o 3 Day Pass: \$24

Members can take unlimited rides for no additional cost:

Up to 45 minutes for annual Up to 30 minutes for short-term

Additional fees for rides longer than 30/45 minutes

Creating a plan

Potential sites show by intensity of stakeholder preference

- Public and pop-up workshops
- Concentration of support clicks from public web portal
- Lyft operational considerations

Darker shade indicates greater preference



Site Review

Creating a plan

Where possible, less preferred sites were removed from consideration



Draft Plan

Creating a plan

Community preference, site review, and network considerations combined to create a draft plan



Later Steps

Present to draft plan to Community Board

Technical screening & coordination

Create & Release Final Plan Online

Site Specific Outreach & Notifications

 Conduct door-to-door notifications to building owners adjacent to stations

Install Stations

Continued Outreach, Monitoring, & Adjustment
