What is Bike Share?




# What is Bike Share?

#### Shared-use Mobility

- Network of shared bicycles
  - Intended for point-to-point transportation
- Increased mobility
  - Convenient for trips that are too far to walk, but too short for a taxi or the subway
- Always available
  - System operates 24/7
- Payments vary
  - Pay-per-ride or memberships available





# What is Dockless Bike Share?

#### **Different Service Model**


- New technology makes it possible for a system without docks
  - Unlocked via app
- Generally pay as you go
  - Some low-income options
- Potential to expand quicker with less up front cost than traditional docked bike share
  - No docks, no installations, less planning involved







#### General Parking Guidelines

- Search
- Scan
- Unlock
- Ride
- Park/Lock

#### Parking Guidelines

- Bikes must be parked on the sidewalk with existing street furniture
- Bikes must leave a straight, unobstructed path of 6' or more for pedestrian traffic
- Bikes must not:
  - Block any doorway, driveway, curb cut, subway entrance
  - Be parked in a bus stop
  - Be parked in a crosswalk or intersection
  - Be parked on private property





    - Withdrew on 9/30/2018








# 2018 Staten Island Pilot

### **Pilot Recap**

- Pilot launched 7/26
- 400 bikes in operation
  - Lime (200)
  - Jump (200)
- 3 extensions given
  - November 2018, February 2019, May 2019
- Pilot analyzed:
  - Usage
  - Rider satisfaction
  - Safety
  - Sidewalk blocking
  - Durability of bikes
  - Data compliance
- Over 68,000 trips taken as of April 2019





#### Feedback Survey

- ~100 responses from SI residents
  - Winter 2019
  - In person + online
  - About 50/50 response rate from users vs non-users
- Overall, very positive response










#### **Community Requests**




Larger scale, longer term


- Given desire, need to evaluate system at scale

- Continue to refine operations based on feedback and findings








